Important Guidelines for Students

1. The student will run the risk of removal from the school rolls for non-payment of dues and continuous absence for 10 days.

2. The students may be rusticated for misconduct, which includes unpunctuality, irregular attendance, use of abusive language, and misbehavior of any level.
3. Ragging is a punishable offense under the law, and a student found guilty of it will be liable for expulsion from the school.
4. Re-admission after removal from the school rolls is strictly at the discretion of the Principal.
5. 75% attendance is compulsory to be eligible for H.P. school board annual examination. 20% pass marks in terminal tests in each subject and aggregate should be 25%.
6. Every student must come to school in proper school uniform.
7. Every student must take weekly/monthly/house tests as and when prescribed.
8. No student should enter the staff room and the office of the Principal without any purpose.
9. Every student must give due respect to all the staff members.
10. Every student must obey the directions, rules, and orders of the school Principal.

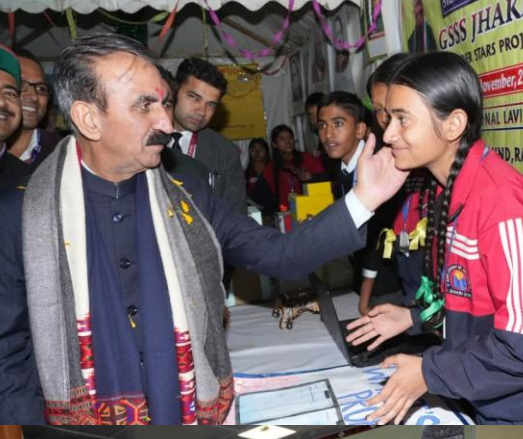
